


# Lesson Plan

Grade Level: Kindergarten  
Subject: Language Arts

## Overview & Purpose

The following lesson establishes the concept of daytime and nighttime and the events that occur in both.

	Teacher Guide	
<b>Objectives</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Students will learn the difference between daytime and nighttime</li><li>• Students will learn what activities take place during daytime and nighttime</li></ul>	<b>Materials Needed</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Visual Aids</li><li>• Coloring Pencils</li><li>• Coloring Sheets</li></ul>
<b>Instruction</b>	Teacher will introduce daytime with a large picture of the sun. Teacher will discuss with the children that the sun is out in the daytime. Teacher will ask students to tell them what they do in the daytime. Students' responses might include such things as "I wake up in the daytime" OR "I go to school in the daytime." Teacher will introduce nighttime with a large picture of the moon and stars. Teacher will ask the children what happens to the sun when it is nighttime. Children might respond, "The sun goes down" OR "The moon and stars come out" OR "It gets dark." Teacher will ask students to tell what they do at nighttime. Students' responses might include such things as "I go to sleep at nighttime." Teacher then says, "Let's sing a daytime song. The song is "Mr. Sun". Children sing with the teacher along with body motions that go with the song. Teacher then says, "Let's sing a nighttime song." The song is "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star". Children sing with the teacher along with body and hand motions that go with the song. The lesson closes and activity coloring sheet is introduced.	
<b>Activity</b>	Students sing songs with teacher. Students color a daytime sheet and a nighttime sheet.	
<b>Summary</b>	The concepts of daytime and nighttime are taught through visual aids; through interactive discussion of events that occur during each; through songs and through activity coloring sheets.	<b>Additional Notes</b>
